#### Goal #1

By using the School Land Trust monies to improve technology usage in our school, we hope to maintain or improve our school Language Arts, Math, and Science standardized assessment scores. Our hope is that as we continue to improve technology use in these subject areas, content will be more effectively and efficiently delivered to our students and they will be able to retain more content. Utilizing Core Knowledge Guidelines will provide our teachers with important information as they prepare and teach their students. Prior testing allows them to see where their students are and what needs to happen so that they reach the next mastery level benchmark. We believe that this practice will assist our students in achieving higher scores as they move through the curriculum.

## Identified academic area(s): Technology

### This was the action plan.

- 1) American Preparatory Academy (APA) has a Technology Plan that includes a computer replacement schedule so that our stock does not become outdated and need replacing at one time. Draper 3 is due to replace two computer labs this year. 70 Macbook computers with two mobile carts will cost approximately \$70,493.
- 2) American Preparatory Academy (APA) has a Technology Plan that includes a computer replacement schedule so that our stock does not become outdated and need replacing at one time. Draper 3 is due to replace 1 staff computer this year. 1 Macbook computer with a charger and dongles will cost approximately \$1,916.

### Please explain how the action plan was implemented to reach this goal.

- 1) American Prep purchased two replacement computer labs with 70 MacBook Air computers and two recharging carts for \$57,808. This resulted in a savings of \$12,685. This savings was realized due to bulk purchasing and cannot guarantee future pricing.
- 2) American Prep purchased one staff computer for \$858.
- 3) Due to savings, American Prep was able to purchase an additional 13 staff computers.
- 4) Due to savings, American Prep was able to purchase an additional 3 student laptops.
- 5) Teachers used assessment data they collected throughout the year to determine mastery of Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and taught to mastery. Academic teams used the assessment data in their decisions to make technological changes to their content delivery and online practice time.

This is the measurement identified in the plan to determine if the goal was reached.

Standardized assessments (ex. ACT) results will be utilized to determine content mastery.
